

## Marilyn Dee Fillmore September 12, 1931 - April 30, 2021

Marilyn Dee Crawford Fillmore, daughter of Charles N. and Dora Augason Crawford, left her beloved family and home in Draper, UT on April 30, 2021. She was born on September 12, 1931 in Bingham Canyon, UT. She was a lifetime member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and served in many capacities. Marilyn attended Brigham Young University where she earned a BA degree and also met her future husband, L. Reid Fillmore. They were married in the Manti Temple on June 1, 1953. She is the mother of 3 sons and 4 daughters. Between her early marriage years in California and later years in Utah, she taught school for 21 years.
